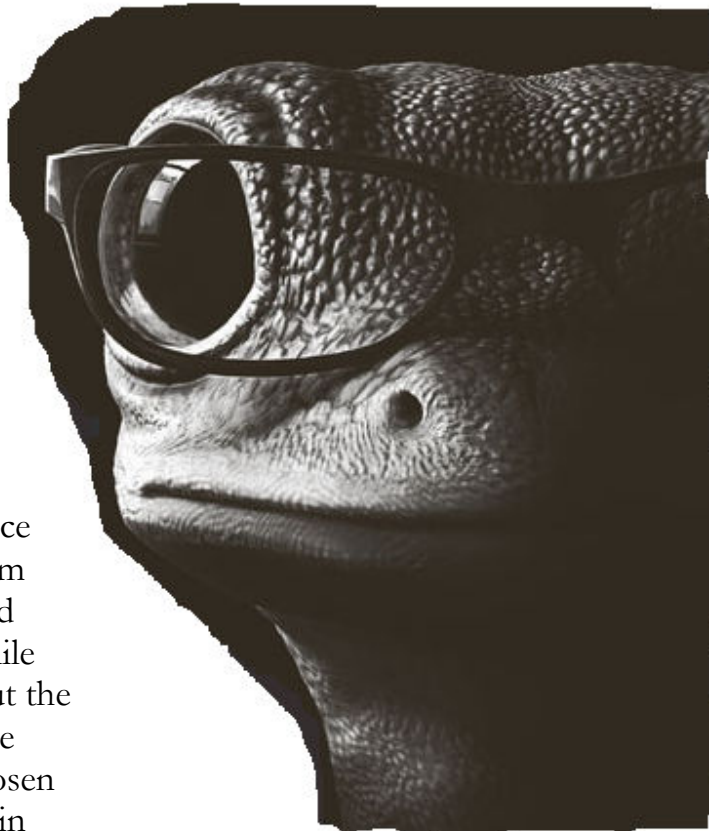

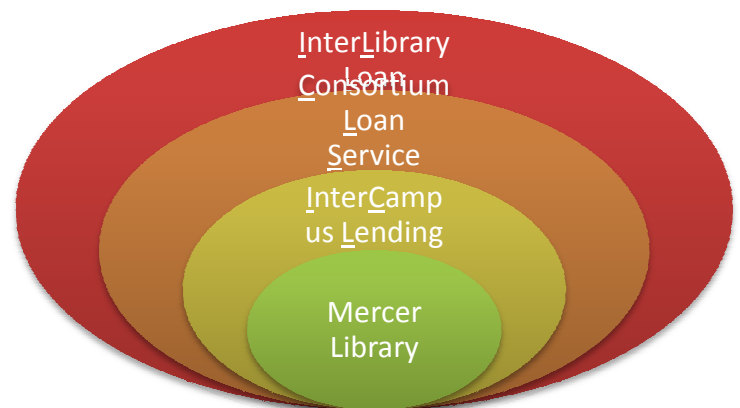

Library Lending Requests - How it works: A Reprise

When seeking materials for use and research, please follow this simple order: Start with Mercer Library. If we don't have it, look at other Mason Campus libraries like Fenwick, the Johnson Center, and Arlington and use **InterCampus Lending**. If Mason doesn't have it, look at the libraries in the consortium through **WRLC** and use the **Consortium Loan Service**. If they don't have it, submit a request through **InterLibrary Loan** and we will find it for you. The farther away from Mercer Library your item is requested, the longer it will take for you to receive your item. The Hands that Built Gunston Hall

Sunday, September 27 • 1:00 – 5:00 p.m., Lecture at 2:00 p.m.

Essential to the construction of 250-year-old Gunston Hall were the many hands that built it. Sawyers, carpenters, blacksmiths, and other workers, mostly slaves owned by George Mason, contributed their skills to creating his mansion. Dr. John Michael Vlach, noted scholar of African-American tradition, gives an illustrated talk about the building of an 18th-century plantation house. Robert M. Watson of The Colonial Williamsburg Foundation demonstrates period woodworking techniques. Shiloh Baptist Church of Mason Neck performs music dedicated to the builders of Gunston Hall.
