E-reference

The University Libraries has recently purchased electronic access to Elsevier's impressive <u>International Encyclopedia of the Social & Behavioral Sciences</u>. The electronic access to this important reference source, available both on and off campus to GMU faculty, staff, and students, is linked to the main record for this title in the <u>GMU Catalog</u>. A brief description is included below.

This Encyclopedia is the first attempt in a generation to map the social and behavioral sciences on a grand scale. Not since the publication in 1968 of the International Encyclopedia of the Social Sciences, edited by David L. Sills, has there been such an ambitious project to describe the state of the art in all the fields encompassed within the social and behavioral sciences.

Available in both print (26 volumes) and online editions, it comprises 4,000 articles, commissioned by 52 Section Editors, and includes 90,000 bibliographic references as well as comprehensive name and subject indexes

This resources is ideal for students and faculty in all fields of the social and behavioral sciences and covers:

Institutions and infrastructure; History of the social and behavioral sciences; Ethics of research and applications; Biographies; Integrative concepts and issues; Statistics; Mathematics and computer sciences; Logic of inquiry and research design; Anthropology; Archaeology; Demography; Economics; Education; Geography; History; Law; Linguistics; Philosophy; Political science; Clinical and applied psychology; Cognitive psychology and cognitive science; Developmental, social, personality and motivational psychology; Sociology; Evolutionary sciences; Genetics, behavior and society; Behavioral and cognitive neuroscience; Psychiatry; Health; Gender studies; Religious studies; Expressive forms; Environmental/ecological sciences; Science and technology studies; Area and international studies; Organizational and management studies; Media studies and commercial applications; Urban studies and planning; Public policy; Modern cultural concerns.
