Finding Accessible Media in George Mason University Libraries' Catalog:

Many videorecordings in the University Libraries are closed-captioned. While the Libraries' catalog often notes when media have closed-captioning, please note that the best way to determine captioning is to check the item.

In the catalog, information about language, closed-captions and audio description appears in the Notes field of a record. For example:

Notes: English or French soundtracks; optional subtitles in English or Spanish; closed-captioned in English.

Notes: English dialogue; optional Spanish subtitles; Optional English subtitles for the deaf and hard of hearing (SDH); audio description for the blind and visually-impaired.

Finding Accessible Media Elsewhere:

When the University Libraries does not own an accessible item, please try the following:

- 1. Try your search in <u>ALADIN</u>, the catalog of the Washington Research Library Consortium (WRLC). Accessible items not owned by George Mason University Libraries can be requested by faculty from a WRLC member institutions. - 2. Contact the Media Services Librarian regarding acquiring an accessible item. Contact information is below.
