

Concept Map: Plan Your Research

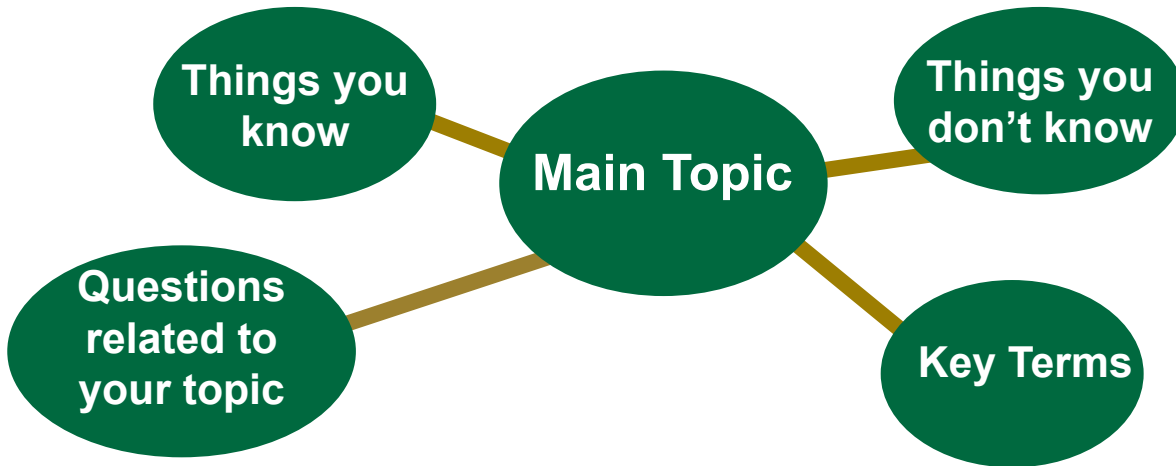
A concept map helps you build on what you know, create new connections, and organize your research. The simplest ways to make a concept map are either by hand-drawing it or using PowerPoint.

How to make a concept map?

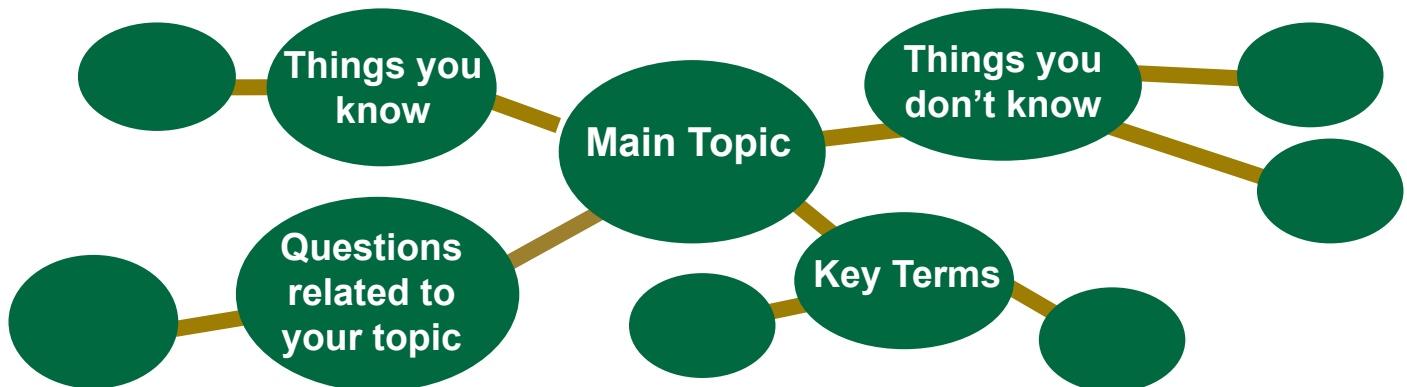
1. Begin with putting your topic in a center bubble.



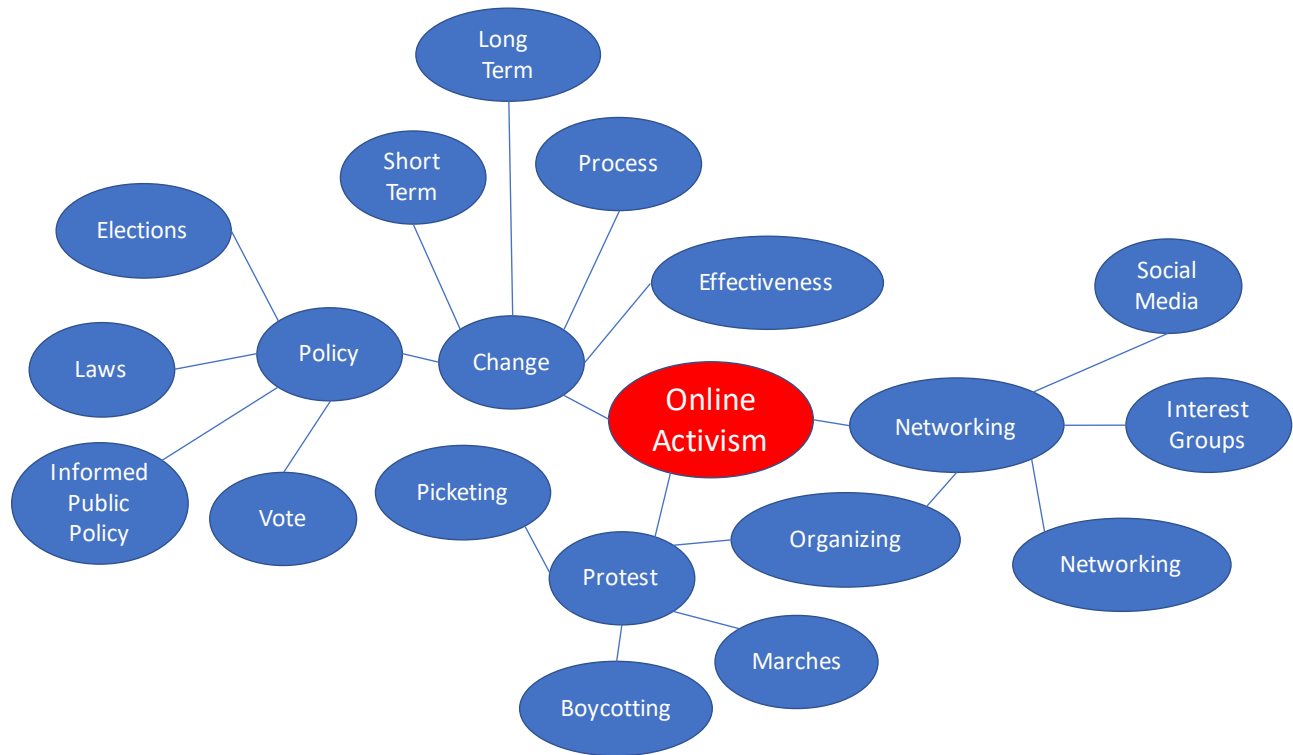
2. Then, branch off of your main point to other connected sections. One way to organize this is to divide sections by things you know, things you do not know, key terms, and questions you have.



3. Continue to branch out your bubbles and add more connected thoughts.
